Attendance Reminders: It is very important to review the <u>daily schedule</u> with your middle school child. Students are expected to be in their seat and ready for learning at the start of each class. Students will be marked as tardy if they arrive 7 minutes past the start time of class. Daily attendance is taken in each of the four blocks. If a student is experiencing technical difficulties or will be absent from class, please submit notices in the <u>parent attendance portal</u>. When teachers are absent from class, they use warm-ups and exit tickets to account for attendance. Students are expected to attend all blocks every day. Beginning 2nd quarter, teachers will be checking in with students throughout the block to ensure they are present. Students must respond to the teacher via chat, by speaking, or by turning on the camera to be marked present.

When teachers are absent from class, they use Google forms, warm-ups, etc. to account for attendance. Students are expected to attend all blocks every day. Beginning 3rd quarter, teachers will be checking in with students throughout the block to ensure they are present. Students must respond to the teacher via chat, by speaking, or by turning on the camera to be marked present.

SAT Scores on Transcripts: Students have the option to opt out of SAT or ACT scores being reported on their transcript. Please note that even though colleges may waive the testing option for admissions, some scholarships may still require an SAT or ACT score. If you would like the testing score to be excluded on the transcript, fill out the attached form and return to the school counseling office.
